Wisdom 11:22-12:2, Psalm 145, 1 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2, Luke 19:1-10

Jesus is "crazier" than Zacchaeus

At today's Mass, we turn to the Lord and thank him for the example of Zacchaeus, who shows us the path to forgiveness one-on-one with Jesus, how to overcome whatever hinders us from contact with the Lord and how to made amends for our sins against God and neighbor. Just like the Lord went to the lowest place on earth to bring Zacchaeus back to the fold, so the Lord Jesus will continually come to save us, no matter how far we've sunk, and no matter how many times we've fallen. And there's nothing he won't do to save us.

When we and the whole human race were incapable of seeing Him on account of the great weight of sin which was reducing our humanity to smaller and smaller images of what we are called to be, and thereby when we were incapable of climbing any tree at all, he, out of his great love for us, *climbed one on our own behalf*, so that each of us might still be able to see him, perched upon his glorious wooden throne. He invites each of us here and now in this Eucharistic participation in his death and resurrection, to be lifted up by him onto that life-giving tree, so that as God's children we might spend eternity in that celestial tree house built upon the Cross' firm foundation.

Today, he calls us by name and says, "I must stay in *your* house today." Even though we, like the Centurion, will soon cry out, humbly, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof," Jesus— if we do what we learn from Zacchaeus— will say the word and we will be healed. "The Son of Man," Jesus tells us at the end of the Gospel passage, "has come to seek and to save what was lost." He has come to seek and save us sinners. May His salvation come to our homes and our lives today! Amen!

Letter to a Suffering Church: A Bishop Speaks on the Sexual Abuse Crisis is Bishop Robert Barron's appeal to Catholics questioning their faith and searching for hope and encouragement amid the most recent scandal. Bishop Barron, Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, offers a clear path forward by looking at the current crisis through the lens of Scripture and Church history.

Copies of the book, which is targeted to adults and is being widely circulated among many Catholic parishes, will be available this advent season in the Narthex for interested parishioners to take. National Vocation Awareness Week, celebrated November 3-9, 2019, is an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promote vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations. NVAW

began in 1976 when the U. S. bishops designated the 28th Sunday of the year for NVAW. In 1997, this celebration was moved to coincide with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which falls on January 13 in 2013. Beginning in 2014, NVAW was moved to the first full week of November.

Community/Diocesan Events



The Weekend of November 9/10 there will be a 2nd Collection for the Archdiocese of Military Service.

The Archdiocese for the Military Services was created by Pope John Paul II to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries and spiritual services to those in the United States Armed Forces. This includes more than 220 installations in 29 countries, patients in 153 V.A. Medical Centers, and federal employees serving outside the boundaries of the USA in 134 countries. Numerically, the AMS is responsible for more than 1.8 million men, women, and children.

The AMS is a church entity. It is not a part of the Armed Forces and is not funded by the federal government. It is a "home" mission diocese that depends almost entirely on financial support from individual donors including personal donations from its military and VA chaplains, gifts from military communities, gifts from dioceses, charitable bequests, and grants.

The AMS carries out its worldwide mission with a very small, full-time staff comprised of 6 clergy, 3 religious and 17 laity. The major cost elements of the annual \$4 million operating budget are:

- •Pastoral Programs (Vocations, Youth/Young Adult Ministries, Veterans) and clergy worldwide travel
- •Sacramental Records and Marriage Tribunal
- •Supporting Services (Administration, Finance, Development, and Communications)
