## **Upcoming Parish News/Events**

#### Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time 2019—Year C

(Isaiah 6, 1-8; Psalms: 137; I Corinthians 15, 1-11; Luke 5, 1-11)

God speaks to us in our own language sometimes, for example, by means of a miraculous catch of fish. When Jesus was born, those studying the stars saw a special star in the sky. In Acts 10, Peter was hungry, and God gave him a vision of all kinds of creatures commanding him to eat, to show that no person is unclean in God's eyes. In today's Gospel, God speaks again in our language; Jesus gave Peter the fisherman a huge catch of fish to symbolize his future ministry.

Now we see another kind of emptiness in Peter as he says, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." (Luke 5:8) He recognizes his unworthiness before Christ but once again Jesus fills that emptiness, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." (Luke 5:10) Peter received a miraculous catch of fish because he had nothing but a generous willing heart. Now he receives his vocation from Jesus when he acknowledges his unworthiness. So it is okay to have nothing and be unworthy. Jesus provides more than we would have hoped and calls us despite our unworthiness. All that is necessary is the generous willingness of Peter and Jesus does the rest.

#### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

"Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?' 'Here I am,' I said, 'send me!'" (ISAIAH 6:8) Every day, in little ways and in big ways, God asks, "Whom shall I send?" Whether it is someone to take on a new ministry, to give a friendly smile to a stranger or say a word of encouragement to a friend, God constantly provides opportunities to help someone in need. The next time you hear God calling, have the courage to walk through the door and say "Here I am, Lord."


#### **BULLETIN SUBMISSIONS**

### U.S. Bishops' Chairman on Pro-Life Activities Calls All People of Good Will to Stand Up and Protect Unborn and Born Infants - 2/1/19

February 1, 2019 WASHINGTON—Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City, KS and Chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities has issued the following statement in response to the introduction of a bill in the Virginia legislature that would allow a baby to be aborted at nine months. Although the bill was defeated there, a similar bill was passed by the New York legislature and signed into law by its Governor. Archbishop Naumann's full statement follows: "A Virginia lawmaker has introduced a bill which would allow a baby to be aborted at nine months, even if the mother is just about to give birth. This legislation shocks the conscience and is made more egregious by the Governor of Virginia suggesting the permissibility of denying care to infants born alive during the abortion. This senseless disrespect for new human life is horrifying. We join the bishops of Virginia in urging all people of good will to stand up to protect unborn and born infants from legislation that would permit their gruesome deaths."

#### **ADORATION**

Adoration is when we go to the church and pray in front of the Blessed Sacrament. You can go any time into the church to privately pray before the tabernacle, like a private adoration. But when people speak of adoration, they usually mean going to church during the time when the parish has Adoration with Exposition scheduled. This is when the priest takes a consecrated Host out of the tabernacle and puts it in a special holder called a "monstrance" that is placed on the altar. The monstrance has a round glass window that the Host in placed in, so that it is exposed, or visible, to the people. Parishioners (or anyone, really) are encouraged to come during Adoration with Exposition. The people are "adoring," or worshipping, Christ in His Real Presence in the Eucharist. While you are there sitting quietly in the pew before the Real Presence, you can pray, read spiritual books, meditate on a mystery of the faith, ponder God's will for us, etc.

Here at St. Mary's parish, we have Adoration with Exposition every Wednesday and Thursdays between 8:30am to 9:30am before mass. On Tuesday, Adoration is from 9:00am to 10:00am before mass.
