FAMILY ACTIVITIES FOR THE LENTEN SEASON

Daily Prayer Time - It's important that kids grow up feeling that prayer is a natural thing. Each evening spend time in prayer on a certain topic of your choosing. (ex. the health of loved ones, members of your church, people groups close to your heart, upcoming elections, etc.)

Make Lenten Intentions - Have each family member pray and choose a food or hobby/activity to give up during Lent. If giving up TV is not reasonable, perhaps giving up TV only on certain days is more practical. Especially children - do not make the sacrifice so difficult that you are miserable or have little hope of continuing it all through Lent.

EWTN plays good catholic movies every Saturday night at 8:00 pm, how about watching together as a family this lent.

Attend Stations of the Cross together - offered each Friday at 7:00 p.m. in the church

Shortly after the soup supper. Tradition states that the first stations of the cross, similar to what we know today, were developed by St. Francis of Assisi and in 1686 Blessed Pope Innocent XI gave the Franciscan monks permission to place the stations in all of their churches. The devotion spread, and the stations were soon found in every church.

Find Something to Give Away - As a family, go through your possessions and find gently used (or well-loved but still good quality) items, then pray about how you can bless others with those things. You can give toys, clothes or baby gear to pregnancy support centers, foster care agencies, or families in need.

Reach out to someone else - Whether by text, email, or handwritten card, choose a person today and send them a line or two of encouragement. An "I'm thinking of you" or "we're praying for you" can mean more than you think. Check a list of my home bound parishioners to reach out.

A spending fast - You can't avoid over spending money on groceries for 6 weeks, but commit to not spend for clothes, technology, or entertainment. Put that money aside to bless others and learn to practice gratitude daily for the things you already own.

Music Ministry Update

The Music Ministry comes together to serve 1) God 2) The Priest 3) The Liturgy 4) The Parishioners and 5) Each Other. For the Mass we strive to be song leaders in support of our fellow Parishioners to enhance or add to your prayerful participation. We are careful not to make the music about us or make it a performance. Music is prayer. Aligning that prayer to the Liturgy in support of the Priest to ensure that we are offering everything up to God is a blessing and a gift. We want the Lord to hear everyone sing His praise! To support that mission, we did make changes to the Music Ministry area in the church. The pews were removed and replaced by chairs facing the congregation, the piano and organ were moved and storage was added. The changes were made primarily to improve the communication and sound of the

group and better project the music to the congregation. One challenge with the previous setup was that the singers had their backs to the musicians. It was very difficult to hear each other and communicate. Imagine having a conversation with someone for an hour that has their back to you and trying to hear them. Turning the singers to the congregation allows the accompanist to hear the vocalists and dramatically improves communication. The other advantage is that the singers are now facing the congregation (at least we hope everyone believes that is an advantage!) which helps the Music Ministry as Song Leaders.

We continue to make minor changes as we adjust to the space. We're currently working on changes to the number and position of the microphones. You may have noticed that the organ was out of commission for a while which was due to the bench breaking. Thank you, Alex Sinlock, for building a new organ bench for the Parish! It looks fantastic, is sturdy and stained to match the organ!
