## **Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time** 2019—Year C

Ecclesiasticus 27:4-7. Psalm: 91(92):2-3, 13-16. 1 Corinthians 14:54-58. Luke 6:39-45

Sirach says that people's faults appear when they speak, especially when they speak and aren't considering their words. We often hide behind masks but conversation reveals our inner thoughts no matter how careful we are to dissemble. Speech is a means of testing the inner character of a person, because what comes in speech betrays what's in our heart. The climax of the reading is the last line (v. 7), saying that what a person says is clearly the test of that person. Sirach's teaching is very relevant for human integrity in today's world of public relations and image-making, the soundbite and the slogan.

#### **Music Ministry Update**

The Music Ministry comes together to serve 1) God 2) The Priest 3) The Liturgy 4) The Parishioners and 5) Each Other. For the Mass we strive to be song leaders in support of our fellow Parishioners to enhance or add to your prayerful participation. We are careful not to make the music about us or make it a performance. Music is prayer. Aligning that prayer to the Liturgy in support of the Priest to ensure that we are offering everything up to God is a blessing and a gift. We want the Lord to hear everyone sing His praise!

To support that mission, we did make changes to the Music Ministry area in the church. The pews were removed and replaced by chairs facing the congregation, the piano and organ were moved and storage was added. The changes were made primarily to improve the communication and sound of the group and better project the music to the congregation. One challenge with the previous setup was that the singers had their backs to the musicians. It was very difficult to hear each other and communicate. Imagine having a conversation with someone for an hour that has their back to you and trying to hear them. Turning the singers to the congregation allows the accompanist to hear the vocalists and dramatically improves communication. The other advantage is that the singers are now facing the congregation (at least we hope everyone believes that is an advantage!) which helps the Music Ministry as Song Leaders. We continue to make minor changes as we adjust to the space. We're currently working on changes to the number and position of the microphones. You may have noticed that the organ was out of commission for a while which was due to the bench breaking. Thank you, Alex Sinlock, for building a new organ bench for the Parish! It looks fantastic, is sturdy and stained to match the organ! If you are interested in being part of the Music Ministry come and talk with us! We're easy to find.

# Lenten Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence

**Diocese of Richmond Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence** 

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed. Regulations for Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.
