1st SUNDAY OF ADVENT YEAR A

Isaiah 2:1-5 / Romans 13:11-14 / Matthew 24:37-44

Today, we begin a new liturgical year with this celebration of the first Sunday of Advent. It is a special time of opportunity, a chance to once again pause long enough to listen to God saying to us, "Come to me, listen to me, learn from me, let me show you the way, let me help you to be the person I created you to be, let me give you life". Throughout this time of Advent we will hear St John the Baptist cry out, "prepare a way for the Lord".

We will hear the angel Gabriel say "nothing is impossible for God". Over and over again we will hear the words addressed to many people, "Do not be afraid". We will hear the angel assure Mary, as the Lord assures us, that "the Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High God will cover you with its shadow". And all of this will point to the most important thing of all: a child will be born for us, a Son given to us. He will be Emmanuel, God with us, and in him and through him we will finally begin to know God as he really is – if we make the most of the opportunity to grow in faith which Advent offers us. Advent is a time of hope, a time of promise, a time of opportunity and a time of preparation. But perhaps most of all it is a time of invitation. God wants to come to us, stay with us, help us to grow and lead us to the fullness of life. But God does not force himself upon us: he quite simply offers to come - and we are the ones who must choose to own the doors of our lives, of our hearts, to him - or not to do so.

One of the psalms captures the spirit of Advent beautifully. Let me conclude with the invitation it offer us: "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts".



Scripture and Church history. What is the Raffle

Every time the number on your ticket is an exact match to the Night Time Pick 3 between January 1 and June 30, 2020, you win \$20.

Each ticket is good for 6 months, so buying one ticket is like

buying one lottery ticket every day for 6 months (a \$182 value for only \$20!) Tickets will be available until the end of December. All stubs and money must be returned by 12/31/19. Only paid stubs returned by the deadline can be acknowledged as winners and paid out.

Support My Church and Save on Taxes! What's Better than That?

Want a way to boost your tax savings beyond the newly increased standard deduction? If you are 70 ½ or older, you can use your IRA to make a gift to Saint Mary of the Annunciation and save taxes!

Normally, a distribution from your IRA is taxed as ordinary income. However, federal tax law **now** allows you to make a distribution of up to \$100,000 each year from your IRA to a qualifying charity and it is not subject to federal income tax.

By making a 'qualified charitable distribution' from your IRA, you can give to Saint Mary of the Annunciation and it counts toward your IRA's annual required minimum distribution.
