5th Sunday of Easter, Year C, 18.05.2019

Acts 14:21-27 / Apocalypse 21:1-5 / John 13:31-35

No number of crosses on the walls of our homes or around our necks will make us Christians unless we practice Jesus' commandment of love which is of course so very hard to follow. All of us struggle to put into practice this great teaching of Jesus.

Today's readings remind us that as suffering and death on the cross was the necessary prelude to Jesus' exaltation and enthronement in heaven and so are our hardships to inherit true peace and joy in life here on earth and in heaven.

We read in the Acts of the Apostles that two of the apostles, Paul and Barnabas, returned to Antioch to strengthen the believers and to encourage them to persevere in faith. In the previous chapter (13:50) to today's text we are told, "The Jews stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas and expelled them from their territory."

So, despite the animosity and persecution, the two apostles went back to the city and continued to preach to the people there boldly. They said, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships before we can enter the kingdom of God."

In other words, they warned the believers that suffering is an essential part of Christian life. The apostles did not only warned others of suffering, they also gave witness of suffering. In his letter to the Romans (8:35) Saint Paul emphasizes the apostles' commitment and faithfulness to Christ. He says, "Can anything cut us off from the love of Christ - hardships, distress, persecution, lack of food and clothing, threats or violence; as scripture says: For your sake we are being massacred all day long, treated as sheep to be slaughtered?"


