A light can often be a warning light. A light is often the warning which tells us to halt when there is danger ahead. It is sometimes the Christian's duty to bring to his fellow men the necessary warning. That is often difficult, and it is often hard to do it in a way which will not do more harm than good; but one of the most poignant tragedies in life is for someone, especially a young person, to come and say to us, "I would never have been in the situation in which I now find myself, if you had only spoken in time." We need, at times, to be that warning light, preventing from brothers and sisters from doing harm to themselves and others. The light which can be seen, the light which warns, the light which guides, these are the lights which the Christian must be.

Jesus is calling us, my brothers and sisters in Christ, to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. And he would not be calling us to be this salt and light unless he knew that we, attached to him, reflecting his life, were fit for the task

Please bring all Palms and Blessed articles in need of disposal to church no later than February 23rd. These items will be burned after the 11:00 AM Mass on the 23rd to make ashes or to be buried.



Because Palms have been blessed by a priest and therefore are holy objects, the palm branches used for Catholic Church services, especially those used on Palm Sunday, should not be disposed of in the regular fashion. Once an object is blessed, it is considered to be in the service of God and should be treated with respect. Therefore, it is considered sacrilegious to throw a holy item in the garbage, where it might end up in a sewer or a landfill. Holy palms should be returned to nature. The Catholic priests take all of the collected palms and burn them. They save the ashes to use for the Ash Wednesday service. Palms are not the only objects routinely blessed by the Catholic Church. Holy water, oils, rosaries and relics also have a special religious significance. Churches typically have a special sink that runs straight into the ground where holy water, oils and blessed wine is discarded. Combustible items may be burned, everything else should be buried in an area where people are not likely to walk, such as under a tree.

Need to use Church Facilities? Get signed up!

St. Mary's is initiating the use of an Event Approval Form, which is required by all parishioners who want to use parish space for both parish and non-parish events, activities, and meetings. The form can be found on the parish website in the **Parish Life section** or requested in hard copy form in the church office. ALL parish events require an approved event request, even those regular, recurring events and meetings that are currently being hosted in parish facilities. This new process will help streamline scheduling of parish events and meetings, ensure that the use of parish facilities is documented, displayed on the online church calendar and advertised (if requested) via Flocknote and the Website. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated!

FAQs

What parish spaces require a reservation/approved event form?

ALL parish spaces – conference room, classrooms, the parish hall, the kitchen, the Narthex, the sanctuary, the BBQ and pavilion, the parking lot, and all other outdoor spaces.

What exactly is an "event"?

Anything happening in the parish is an event - a meeting, a fundraiser, a luncheon, a ministry get-together, a practice, etc. If you are using parish space, you are hosting/participating in an "event."

If my group/ministry is currently using parish space on a regular basis, do we have to complete a form? YES, please. This ensures that your regular meeting time is placed on the church calendar and reserved for you.

A form like this has never been necessary before. Why now?

Our church is very busy! This form ensures the pastor has oversight for all activities taking place in parish facilities, and it provides data on facility usage that is necessary for planning purposes. The electronic form will also notify the parish's communications team about upcoming events so that your meeting or event can be appropriately advertised

What happens after I complete and submit my form?


When completed, the office is alerted, the request reviewed and forwarded to Fr. Alex for approval. Once the review is complete you will be contacted by the parish office as to whether or not your request was approved.


What if someone from outside the parish wants to use our facilities?


