Baptism of the Lord, Year A, 1/12/2020 Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7/ Acts 10:34-38/ Matthew 3:13-17

- 1. The baptism of Jesus reminds us of our identity. It reminds us of who we are and Whose we are. By Baptism we become sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus, members of his Church, heirs of heaven and temples of the Holy Spirit.
- 2. **Jesus' baptism reminds us also of our mission:** a) to experience the presence of God within us, to acknowledge our own dignity as God's children, and to appreciate the Divine Presence in others by honoring them, loving them and serving them in all humility; b) to live as the children of God in thought, word and action. c) to lead a holy and transparent Christian life and not to desecrate our bodies (the temples of the Holy Spirit and members of Jesus' Body), by impurity, injustice, intolerance, jealousy or hatred; d) to accept both the good and the bad experiences of life as the gifts of a loving Heavenly Father for our growth in holiness; e) to grow daily in intimacy with God by personal and family prayers, by meditative reading of the Word of God, by participating in the Holy Mass, and by frequenting the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- 3. It is a day to thank God for the graces we have received in Baptism, to renew our Baptismal promises and to preach Christ's 'Good News' by our transparent Christian lives of love, mercy, service and forgiveness.

SUPPORT GROUP AVAILABLE AT ST. ANN'S

For the past three years, St. Ann's has offered a support group for the separated and divorced. We are offering it to area Catholic parishes, should there be members who are dealing with these issues. The group is lead by two parish members who are married and who are Licensed Clinical Social Workers. The group is not a therapy group, but a support group in which participants can share their struggles with people who are walking similar roads. Members find that they are not alone, and they are not rejected by the church or its community. Instead, they come to understand that divorce and separation is common. When they see that other members experience the same kinds of feelings, they are usually emboldened to also share. They begin to feel accepted and enriched by the conversations, and they begin to make social connections. They often sit together in church or go to restaurants together. They also share resources, such as recommended attorneys and what to expect through the legal process. They also find out about the church's stance on divorce, annulment, and remarriage.

There is no syllabus or required reading. Instead, it is a process of sharing in confidentiality. The role of the group leaders is to keep the conversation moving and make sure everyone is involved. Over the three years of the group's existence, more than a dozen have attended for short or longer periods. Typical meetings include 3-7 group members. Most of them begin to come to grips with the issues and then stop coming regularly, which is a normal expectation. Everyone has other priorities in today's busy times. When the pain begins to recede and practical problems get solved, the group is less necessary to individual members.

The group currently meets monthly, on the 4^{th} Monday of each month, although sometimes there are changes. It meets from 7-8:30 PM in the parlor at St. Ann's. If a member of a local parish may be interested in the group, he or she can call St. Ann's at (804)798-5039.

One of the group leaders will call back to answer questions. Callers can trust that their calls will be handled confidentially.
