A MESSAGE FROM FR. RENNINGER

Dear Friends:

Everybody sings!

When Saint Luke tells the story of the birth of Jesus, it seems like everyone in the story keeps bursting into song! The Virgin Mary sings after the Angel Gabriel appears. The angelic choirs sing "Glory to God in the highest" as the shepherds keep watch. Simeon sings when he sees the Christ-child, welcoming God's salvation.

But, the first person who sings in Luke's Gospel is a man named Zechariah. He and his wife, Elizabeth, are the parents of John the Baptist. John is the one who will announce to the world that the Messiah has come. So Zechariah sings about all these things that God is accomplishing, declaring, "In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace" (Lk. 1:78-79).

Isn't that a beautiful song? It's a song about a God who treats us with "tender compassion." A God whose love "breaks upon us," like a sunrise after a long night. It's a song about a God who sends his Son, so that "those who dwell in darkness" will be given new hope, and those who have struggled will finally experience "peace!" The holy singing in Luke's Gospel announces that the long struggle is coming to an end. The things that we lost are being restored, and the weariness of our struggles will be healed by the Prince of Peace. This year, as the great feast of Christmas draws near, there are daily signs that people are experiencing the restoration, healing and peace that was first promised when Jesus was born. After a long period of uncertainty, change and loss, God's light is shining in our lives, and people are rejoicing as we once again experience the things which bring us joy.

Here at Saint Mary of the Annunciation Parish, numerous parishioners have returned to church, gathering safely for worship and outreach. Religious Education and sacramental preparation programs are back. Baptisms are being celebrated. These are living signs that the life of the parish is being restored by God's grace.

Thanks to your generosity, we are able to brighten the lives of our neighbors who have specific needs. The hungry are fed, the lonely are visited, the sick are cared for, strangers are welcomed. At Thanksgiving and Christmas, our outreach ministries bless dozens of families, bringing them practical assistance and the love of Christ. On a daily basis, people are comforted by the restoration of daily human activities which forge connections – a meal shared around a table, a hug, a visit.

Meanwhile, the Gospel of Luke keeps singing the central mystery of this season: *Emmanuel!* God is with us! God's love has taken flesh in the child born in Bethlehem. Through Jesus, our brokenness is made whole and our hope is restored. Through Jesus, God's light breaks upon us and we learn how to love others.

And that, my friends, should make everybody sing!

end after church services for anyone who wishes to participate. Please email kellyekirtley@gmail.com for an electronic copy of the packet or questions.


