

Guidelines from the Diocese of **Richmond per the Amended Executive** Order 72, Executive Order 79 and the CDC:

Masks – Fully vaccinated people no longer need to wear a mask in any setting.

All those who are unvaccinated or not-fully vaccinated ages 5 and older should cover their mouth and nose with a mask when present for any Mass or liturgical celebration.

Lord's Prayer and Sign of Peace - Parishes are to continue the practice of refraining from holding hands during the Lord's Prayer and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace (bow or verbal gesture is appropriate).

Distribution of the cup. The distribution of the cup remains suppressed for deacons and the lay faithful until further notice.

Dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass. Though capacity limits for liturgies is lifted effective May 28, 2021 and those fully vaccinated may attend liturgical celebrations without a mask, some members of the faithful may not feel comfortable at liturgical celebrations with unmasked attendees, Bishop Knestout continues to dispense all of the faithful of the Diocese of Richmond from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days until further notice.


2021 Annual Diocesan Appeal -Building Our Family of Faith

How Pope Francis Invites Us to Make the World Less Cold and More Just


