#### A MESSAGE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR:

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last weekend, Fr. Tom Kuhneman (the Vicar for Clergy in the Diocese of Richmond) celebrated all of the Masses in Ladysmith. During those celebrations, Fr. Kuhneman and Fr. Muddu explained that Fr. Muddu will be temporarily unable to carry out his pastoral responsibilities due to an unexpected delay in the renewal of governmental paperwork.

Bishop Knestout has asked me to serve as the *temporary* administrator of St. Mary of the Annunciation parish in Ladysmith. It will be my privilege to assist all of you while Fr. Muddu and diocesan officials work to resolve this immigration paperwork challenge that has had an impact on a number of priests in our diocese in recent months.

As the administrator of St. Mary of the Annunciation, it will be my privilege to work with your outstanding deacons, the parish staff, and the leaders of the Parish Council and Finance Council to insure that all aspects of parish life can continue to thrive. I had the opportunity to meet with your deacons on October 4 in the parish office, and I have been in touch with the parish staff and the leaders of the Parish Council and Finance Council. I am grateful for their generous leadership in this parish community!

This past week, we worked together to identify priests who will come to St. Mary of the Annunciation for Masses and Confessions. I am pleased to report that we have made arrangements for priests to celebrate all of the weekend and Holy Day Masses between now and the end of the year. The deacons of the parish have graciously agreed to lead a Communion Service on Tuesday mornings.

Priests have also volunteered to be available to preside at funerals, and additional priests are available to visit parishioners who are admitted to the hospital or who may need to receive the Sacrament of Anointing.

If you know that you will be going to the hospital or having a medical procedure, I encourage you to approach one of the visiting priests after weekend Masses. They will be happy to anoint you while you are at Church.

If a pastoral emergency arises, please call the parish office and follow the instructions on what to do in an emergency. The parish deacons will receive emergency calls and will serve as a connection point between parishioners and the priests who have graciously volunteered to be of service to this parish.

In the weeks ahead, I will continue to share news with you through the parish bulletin and through Flocknote.

If you have any specific questions, please do not hesitate to speak to one of our deacons when you see them. Or, you may call me at Saint Mary's parish in Richmond, where I continue to serve as pastor. The number for Saint Mary's in Richmond is 804-740-4044.
