AN UPDATE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR:

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

From October 11-14, the priests of the Diocese of Richmond gathered for their annual convocation. During this meeting in Harrisonburg, we heard an update about how several priests of our diocese have been (or may be) impacted by the federal government's delay in processing routine immigration paperwork. While there are some signs of improvement in this situation, we know that priests like Fr. Muddu are being impacted by these delays. Around the diocese, there are parishes where the pastor is not currently permitted to work due to these issues. While the bishop and his lawyers are doing all that they can to expedite this process for Fr. Muddu and other priests, Bishop Knestout is also working to provide support and priestly outreach to every parish that is impacted by this situation.

Above all, Bishop Knestout asked us to pray for all of the priests whose ministries have been interrupted by these challenges. I encourage every member of the parish in Ladysmith to offer daily prayers for Fr. Muddu!

We are grateful to Fr. Tim Kuhneman, the Vicar for Clergy in the Diocese of Richmond, who assisted with the weekend Masses for the past two weeks. For the weekend of October 16/17, Msgr. Francis Muench will be present to preside at the Eucharist.

Looking ahead, I will be with you for all of the Masses on the weekend of October 30/31. It will be a privilege to pray with you that weekend.

In my role as administrator of the parish, my primary task is to answer questions, provide information, and to coordinate the efforts of our deacons, staff members, and ministry leaders so that the day-to-day work of the parish can continue. To that end, in recent days I have been in touch with the leaders of the pastoral council and the finance council. Your wonderful parish deacons communicate with me on a daily basis, and I am spending time with the office staff on October 14. I am also working with the priests of the Richmond area so that we can be sure that someone is available to celebrate Masses in Ladysmith each weekend.
