Dear Friends,

With election day drawing near, many people across the Commonwealth are preparing to exercise their right to vote. In fact, early voting has started across Virginia.

As Catholics, we understand that it is both our civic and sacred duty to vote. In a recent letter to Catholics throughout Virginian, Bishop Knestout (Richmond) and Bishop Burbidge (Arlington) encouraged us to prayerfully and carefully form our consciences as we make decisions about this year's election. The bishops said:

"We are blessed to live in a country where we have the freedom to elect our leaders. At the same time, we know that politics have become more divisive and destructive in our communities and even, at times, within our families. Our unity and peace must be founded in and inspired by the healing power of Jesus Christ. May we bring his truth, peace and unity with us to the ballot box in this election, and always."


