From St. Mary's via Route 1—Turn left onto Ladysmith Road (Route 639), go 3 miles to light, turn right onto Route 1, go 5 miles to Fox Insurance Agency and turn right onto Paige Road (Route 605), cemetery will be 1.4 miles on your right.

From St. Mary's via Bull Church Road—Turn left onto Ladysmith Road (Route 639), make a left right after the Madison Elementary School onto Bull Church Road (Route 633), travel 4.8 miles and take left onto Paige Road (Route 605), cemetery will be 0.6 miles on your left.



WHAT IS A SYNOD?

A message from Fr. Michael Renninger

A synod. What is a "synod?" Pope Francis has asked the church throughout the world to participate in a two-year process called a "synod." The word "synod" comes from Greek roots, and it means "gathering together" or "making a journey together." So, when Pope Francis asks us to participate in a synod, he is inviting Catholics to *gather* together and to *make a journey* together. The Pope is calling us to participate in an ancient practice of our church.

In the New Testament, when the earliest Christians faced important new questions or challenges, they had an instinct to *gather together*. After all, Jesus said, "where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Mt. 18:20). As the early Christians prayerfully *gathered* in the name of Jesus, they *listened*. They listened to the Word of God. They listened to each other. They talked together, trying to listen to what the Holy Spirit was saying to them.

As a result of that prayerful gathering and listening, the early church moved forward in faith, confident that the Holy Spirit had spoken to them about what God wanted to do *in* and *through* his people, his Church. Throughout Christian history, that kind of gathering and listening — called a synod - has happened in many places and in many circumstances.

Today, our Holy Father is asking *all of us* to participate in a focused time of listening, conversation, and prayer, so that we can ask the Holy Spirit to show us what *God's* priorities are for his church as we move forward in faith. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we are being asked to come together, to listen to the Word of God, and to speak with one another about our hopes for the life of church.

It all begins on the local level, where parishioners will come together for prayer and discussion. From these local conversations, ideas and priorities will emerge on a diocesan and national level. Then the Pope will convene a larger gathering at the end of this two-year process, to discern the key insights that the Lord has provided to all of us through this process.

Pope Francis reminds us that when God's people sit down to speak with one another, we *encounter* each other in new ways. When you sit down at your parish to participate in a synod session, you may find yourself in a wonderful discussion with other parishioners which will help us all learn more about Christ.

In the weeks ahead, we will share additional information about how the synod conversations will take place in our local community. At Mass, we will pray for the Holy Spirit to guide our listening. Now that we know what the word "synod" means, let's pray that we will all listen to what the Holy Spirit wants to tell us!
