RCIA - The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

RCIA- The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a parish ministry that invites those who are not baptized, baptized but not Catholic or those who were baptized Catholic but not fully initiated, i.e., received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation, to inquire about becoming fully initiated into the Catholic faith.

This weekend we hear in the Psalms, "May the Lord bless us all the days of our lives". Does every day of your life seem blessed? On good days and happy times, we feel blessed. On other days, not so much. Hard as things may be, it is then that our faith needs to be strongest. How can we learn to trust Jesus during those times? We all need to grow and share our faith.

DID YOU KNOW...at the Consecration of the Mass, "Transubstantiation", that is, describes the change of the bread and wine into the substance of the Body and Blood of Christ. The term was adopted in 1215 by the Fourth Lateran Council.


