This year our annual parish fellowship event will be a Parish Tailgate on Sunday, 9/26, beginning at 12:30 p.m.!



RCIA - The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

RCIA- The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a parish ministry that invites those who are not baptized, baptized but not Catholic or those who were baptized Catholic but not fully initiated, i.e., received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation, to inquire about becoming fully initiated into the Catholic faith.

This weekend we read in the Gospel of Mark "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it".

God's kingdom is available for all, not just the select few. Sharing and growing in your faith is a way for you to grow in love of God. 



