RCIA - The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

RCIA- The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a parish ministry that invites those who are not baptized, baptized but not Catholic or those who were baptized Catholic but not fully initiated, i.e., received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation, to inquire about becoming fully initiated into the Catholic faith.

This weekend we read from Numbers Moses saying to Joshua, "Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets! Would that the Lord might bestow his spirit on them all!" Each of us who are baptized have been anointed exactly as Moses was hoping! When we are anointed with the Chrism of Salvation, we are given "...a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit" and "...anointed Priest, Prophet, and King...". What do you do with the Holy Spirit and in your role as a Prophet? One way is to meet Jesus's challenge and to grow and share your faith. If you are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith and possibly becoming Catholic, please reach out and we will be glad to share and answer any questions. If you are already Catholic, consider asking others about becoming Catholic and offering to journey with them as a sponsor.

DID YOU KNOW...On Monday, September 27th, we mark the Feast Day of St. Vincent de Paul in the Diocese of Richmond while the rest of the Catholic Church marks it as a Memorial? A Feast Day has its own liturgical implications (e.g., we say the "Gloria" at Mass) and is "lesser rank than a solemnity and a higher rank than a memorial" (Catholic Dictionary). Why in Richmond is it a Feast? St. Vincent de Paul is the Principal Patron of the Diocese of Richmond. St. Vincent is the patron of charities, hospitals, prisoners, as well the Diocese of Richmond!
