WE RESPOND TO THE INVASION OF UKRAINE

In recent days many people have asked, "How is a Christian supposed to respond to the invasion of Ukraine?" In his Letter to the Philippians, Saint Paul says, "Pray about everything" (4:6).

Each Tuesday during Lent, our parish hosts an hour of Eucharistic Adoration (9:00 AM) prior to our Communion Service (10:00

During this hour of prayer, the Blessed Sacrament is placed on the Altar. Parishes around the diocese are inviting parishioners to come to church during Lenten Adoration. Pray the Rosary, asking the Blessed Virgin Mary to intercede for peace. Spend time in silent prayer, asking God's blessing on our brothers and sisters in Ukraine. Pray for all those who are seeking to aid refugees and suffering people. During this time of prayer, ask God to turn the hearts of world leaders toward God's ways of peace. We hope that you can join us on Tuesdays for this special time of **prayer**.

How else are Christians called to respond to the events in Ukraine? Well, in Matthew's Gospel Jesus says, " whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" (Mt. 25:40).

Our brothers and sisters in Ukraine are facing terror, violence and fear on a daily basis. They are hungry and thirsty. They are injured and in need of medical care. Many are fleeing to places like Poland to seek refuge from the violence of Russian troops. Whatever we do for these brothers and sisters, we do for Christ.

In times like this, it can be hard to know which charities can be trusted to actually deliver help to the people who need it the most. If you feel inspired by the Holy Spirit to offer concrete assistance to those who are suffering due to this invasion, Fr. Renninger recommends a charitable organization called "Aid to the Church in Need."

This charity was founded by a Catholic priest after the Second World War, with a focus on bringing direct aid to Christians living under Communist rule in Eastern Europe. Throughout the following decades, Aid to the Church in Need became a Papal Charity, and its works on behalf of Eastern European Christians have given it a presence in every area that is currently being impacted by the war.
