
Adoration

St. Mary of the Annunciation recently enlisted the professional services of *Greater Mission* to conduct a feasibil-

ity study related to a proposed capital campaign. This campaign seeks to fund critical infrastructure needs in the church. These needs include payment for the recently replaced roof, replacement of flooring throughout the church, sacristy, narthex, and bathroom updates, and the construction of a free-standing structure on our property to house the food pantry, meeting space, and classrooms. The study determined that there is enough potential participation from our parish members to support a capital campaign of \$400,000 with a stretch goal of \$500,000. With your help, we can meet, and hopefully exceed these goals to fully fund the many infrastructure needs of the parish. As you will see and hear in upcoming weeks, we will be holding a town hall meeting on October  $2^{nd}$  to go over the results of the feasibility study and to solicit additional responses for prioritizing projects. Please consider joining us to share your thoughts because this is our shared effort, and your voice is critical in the process.
