Knights of Columbus Scholarships!



Saturday April 29th


The games will start at 6:30 PM. Bingo

Come To The Feast Of Divine Mercy! Join us for the Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday, April, 16th, 3:00 PM

The Image of the Divine Mercy, which Our Lord requested to be solemnly blessed and venerated on this day, will be on display in our church. We will also have Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

How should we prepare for this great Feast of Mercy?

- 1.Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter;
- 2. Sincerely repent of all our sins;
- 3.Place our complete trust in Jesus;
- 4.Go to confession, preferably before that Sunday;
- 5.Receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast;
- 6. Venerate the Image of The Divine Mercy;
- 7.Be merciful to others, through our actions, words, and prayers on their behalf.



"Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy. ... I demand from you deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to excuse or absolve yourself from it" (Diary of St. Faustina, 742).
