We are coming towards the end of the active phase of fundraising for our capital campaign. As some of you are aware this is the first time as a pastor that I have embarked on capital campaign. I am grateful to everyone in the parish for their guidance and sup-ROM THE port during this process, your input during the planning process was vitally important. OR'S DESK I am particularly grateful for Chris Nowark, Jim Lepp, Tina Sebak, Jim Huk for the extra time and effort that they put in to make this campaign successful, especially during the

town hall meetings earlier this year. I also wanted to thank the members of the Parish Council and Finance Council for volunteering their time to serve the parish. Your leadership will continue to be beneficial as we now look towards our campus enhancements.

If you attended Mass last weekend, you know that we started the weekend with \$260,000 towards our \$400,000 goal. In our in-pew fundraising effort last weekend, we raised more than \$155,000 bringing the total raised during our capital campaign to \$415.000! I am so grateful to our parishioners for their generous support of this initiative, and I am so happy that the parish will continue to be able to grow and better serve the mission of the church.

As a parish, let's be proud of all that we have done to make this project go over goal.

Members of the parish with knowledge of building and construction codes and methods are invited to join a new building committee I'm forming. This committee will assist our parish leadership with the new food pantry free standing building and classroom space to be funded and completed through the capital campaign. 
