Today Jesus said in the Gospel, "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven." (Matthew 5:12) He commanded us to rejoice in our persecution.

The good news is it will eventually be okay—more than OK. We will possess him in perfect beatitude one day. It's worth anything this valley of tears can throw at us because the valley has an end.
