
We are happy to announce that Bishop Barry C. Knestout has granted the faculty of Priests to distribute Holy Communion under the form of wine during the celebration of Mass.

FROM THE We are going to start the distribution of the Chalice beginning in August. However, prior to PASTOR'S DESK the reintroduction of the distribution of Holy Communion from the Chalice, there are several things that will need to be done.

First, we will need to retrain the Eucharist Ministers. There will be 2 training sessions. **You only need to attend one session**. Sessions will be on Wednesday, July 19th, at 6:30 PM, and Sunday, July 23rd, after 11:00 AM Mass.

Second, we will need to retrain all the children that have formally received their First Holy Communion while under the pandemic-related restrictions. We will have further information about the time and dates in the next coming weeks.

It was Christ's will that this sacrament be received as the soul's spiritual food to sustain and build up those who live with His life, as He said, "He who eats me, he also shall live because of me." (John 6:57). This sacrament is also to be a remedy to free us from our daily defects and to keep us from mortal sin. It was Christ's will, that this sacrament be a pledge of our future glory and our everlasting happiness and, likewise, a symbol of that one body of which He is the head (cf. Luke 22:19 and 1 Corinthians 11:3). He willed that we, as members of His body, should be united to it by firm bonds of faith, hope and love, so that we might all say the same thing, and that there might be no dissensions among us (cf. 1 Corinthians 1:10).



conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible. A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all. Please note that receiving the Chalice is not mandatory.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTER TRAINING

With the resumption of receiving the Precious Blood of Christ from the Cup, we will be offering refresher training for our Extraordinary Ministers and those interested in becoming Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist. Training will be held on Wednesday July 19th at 6:30 PM and Sunday July 23rd after the 11:00 AM Mass. Attendance is only needed for one session. At a minimum, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist must be Confirmed and in good standing with the Church.
