5th Sunday in Ordinary Time Job 7:1-4, 6-7, 1 Cor. 9:16-19, 22-23 Mark 1:29-39

In the First Reading today (Job 7:1-4.6-7) we encounter the famous "patron" of suffering namely, Job. Within the passage he was lamenting with a note of desperation over his difficult situation.

It is pertinent to recall that he lost everything he had in one day including his children and his vast wealth. Job was practically in the eye of the storm of hopelessness. His friend Eliphaz had come to console him and remind him of his great strength that used to be a solace for many. Contrary Job saw gloom in his condition. Life for him became empty because nothing worthwhile seem to come out of it.

We are often like Job that moment when we have so many troubles confronting us from various angles. Sometimes they become so unbearable that we seem to be on the verge of breaking. It could be family issues, career related challenges, financial potholes, relationship strains and indeed so many others.

The good news is that God is aware of everything that is happening to us and He has the right answers for all our questions.

Job did not end his life in suffering. After passing through those turbulences, God reversed his condition and he recovered all that he lost and even got more (Job 42:10).
