The new food pantry building project continues to move along thanks to your generous support of our parish capital campaign. We recently received a final drawing from Morton Buildings, our selected builder, and we expect to also soon receive the corresponding detailed cost breakdown to accomplish this project from start to finish. A short while ago, the company provided us with a preliminary total building construction estimate of less than \$300,000. Besides the capital campaign, proceeds from the previous Living Our Mission campaign will be used to significantly offset building costs.

We're on schedule to present our final building plans to the diocesan Building and Architectural Review Committee (BARC) in the first week of June. Once we receive the expected approval, we can begin to break ground shortly thereafter. The defunct playground site remains the preferred building site for the reasons mentioned in a previous update. Relocation of a new playground built on a nearby section of the church property is a real possibility in the future if there is a parish consensus and willingness to do so.

I hope you find these periodic updates helpful. Please don't hesitate to bring any questions or concerns to my attention or to Jim Lepp and Tina Sebak, chairpersons of the parish and finance councils respectively. Contact information can be found in the parish bulletin each week.

I offer my heartfelt prayers and gratitude for each member of the St. Mary's parish family and am humbled by your contributions to the life of our wonderful parish.
