

#### **Living our Mission Update**

In 2014, the Diocese of Richmond initiated a 5 year fundraising campaign called "Living Our Mission". We received a share of the funds contributed by our parishioners. As a part of this process, Saint Mary of the Annunciation had to designate how the funds would be used for our parish. Our goal was to establishing a Free-Standing Space to Accommodate Our Food Pantry, a Nursery, and Adult Education. As a result, our Living Our Mission fund has over \$75,000 to achieve this goal. Father Muddu, the Pastoral Council and Finance Council are working together to explore ways to achieve the Living Our Mission goal.

And be careful if you mention God in a letter to your employees or you will be mocked by someone in the newspaper. I say to all such business owners that you are in good company: Christ also was mocked.


What has happened to us? We used to be a God-fearing people. But now you're considered strange if you talk about God.
