

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

"Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" – 1 thessalonians 5:16 - 18
This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.

Gift Shoeboxes for Needy International Children - Samaritan's Purse

Since 2000, some St. Mary's parishioners have looked forward to sending gift boxes to boys and girls, ages 2 to 14, who truly need this loving and personal gesture.

For this pandemic year 2020, Samaritan's Purse is encouraging online donations:

- Go directly to this website: <u>samaritanspurse.org/op...</u>
- Follow the online directions. You can select items for your gift box <u>or</u> have a box built for you.
- The cost for one gift box and international shipping is \$25. (A donation bargain!)
- An additional \$6 for the *Greatest Adventure* (Christian booklet in native language) is requested, but optional.
- This is a tax-deductible donation.
- Usual deadline: Before Thanksgiving Day, Mon, Nov 23. This may be extended for online donations.

<u>Shoebox focus for 2020</u>: To deliver majority of boxes to 4,000 islands (mostly Pacific) where Samaritan's Purse has never ventured. I think the uniform size and contents of boxes built online will make them easier to ship and to pass through each nation's customs requirements.

ShopWithScrip



The holidays are coming!! Buy gift cards online with ShopWithScrip and get your shopping done all in one place! Or pick up gift cards to use yourself when you shop in stores or online!

Hard copy gift cards are now available! Order them via the RaiseRight mobile app and have them sent directly to your home! Check out the ShopWithScrip instructions to learn more.

What is ShopWithScrip? It's a fundraising program that rewards organizations with rebates from participating retailers, which St. Mary's has joined along with thousands of other organizations. You, the parishioners, shop like you normally would, and St. Mary's wins!

It's easy! Through ShopWithScrip, parishioners purchase gift cards to retailers they normally patronize. There are hundreds of retailers who participate, including most of those in our own community! St. Mary's

receives a rebate on each gift card purchase, and you use the gift card to shop like you normally do – in person or online. How much the parish gets back depends on the retailer, but usually it's between 2-10%, with some retailers offering up to 20%. That may not seem like much, but with many people making purchases, those small rebates add up!

Although ShopWithScrip makes it possible to order physical gift cards distributed to you in person by the parish, St. Mary's can currently *only* support the online purchase and distribution of gift cards – either e-gift cards or hard copy cards delivered to your home. Check out the instructions to learn more, and please consider giving it a try!
